



Charging under s14(1) Census and Statistics Act 1905

Instruction Number: 3 Last Update: 19 February 2018

Originally issued: 3 September 2014

- 1. The Statistician may issue a Notice under section 10(4) of the *Census and Statistics Act 1905* to a person directing the person to fill up, supply and furnish a form. Notices are often issued when a person has failed to fill up, supply and furnish a Census form in the course of the Census that is held every five years.
- 2. A person who fails to comply with a Notice served under section 10(4) of the Act commits an offence under section 14(1) of the Act. Pursuant to section 21 of the Act and section 4K(2) of the *Crimes Act* 1914 the offence is a continuing offence with a fresh offence committed on each day the person fails to comply with the Notice.
- **3.** The Commonwealth DPP and Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) agree that sentencing should achieve deterrence whilst exercising fairness and consistency. A consistent approach regarding the number of charges to be laid has been settled. This should be between 4 to 6 charges.
